Because of your vital role in patient health, we are asking for your assistance in improving the quality of care for our diabetic members by facilitating preventative care through annual diabetic eye exams and reporting of exam findings.

To help us identify those patients who have already had a diabetic retinal evaluation, please remember to report both an appropriate diabetic diagnosis and their retinopathy and examination status, which may include:

- Conducting a dilated retinal evaluation in a diabetes patient (2022F)
- Photographic documentation of retinal findings (2024F)
- Documenting the severity of retinopathy and presence of absence of macular edema (2021F)
- Communicating findings of a dilated examination with patient's primary care physician (5010F)
- Objective evaluation of retinopathy and/or macular edema (G8397 if performed, G8398 if not performed)
- Documentation of low risk for retinopathy based on current and prior evaluations (3072F)

Routine retinal evaluation is recommended to reduce the risk of diabetes-related blindness. Exams do not require pre-authorization. Selected health plans and/or products may require a referral for specialty care by a Primary Care Physician (PCP).

Diagnosis Code (diabetes without complications):

As a reminder, 3072F should be included in your claim filing to indicate no evidence of diabetic retinopathy in the prior year, when applicable. This code may be separately reimbursable, please refer to your reimbursement schedule and plan specifications.
